Presbytery and all church folk are invited to this celebration.



Christ Church Gabriola Council met and had a great discussion around our final 2 Fresh Start modules.

We settled on #5 Dialogue & #17 Planning for Effective Ministry.

- **5. Dialogue** Searching for Common Ground: An approach to living in community in spite of our differences.
- 17. Planning for Effective Ministry The Discern/Plan/Do/Reflect Cycle: Planning is a cyclical process - "Vision without action is a dream. Action without vision is simply passing the time" (Joel Barker). There must be accountability for action embedded in the cycle and every system needs feedback about how things are going and changing. Cultural relevancy is a key component when discerning the who, what, where, when, why and how of the Spirit's leading and discerning how the church lives into the way of Christ, expressing love for God and neighbour.

Our gifts for Mission & Service support Indigenous ministries in downtown Toronto.

The urban Aboriginal population in Canada has increased dramatically in recent years, with the overwhelming majority of the country's 1.2 million Indigenous people living off reserve.

Toronto Urban Native Ministry has a heart for Indigenous people living on the margins of city life. Founded in 1996, it reaches out to Aboriginal people in precarious life situations: on the streets and in prisons, shelters, hostels, and hospitals.


An ecumenical organization that integrates Christian and Aboriginal spirituality, Toronto Urban Native Ministry provides counselling and spiritual care as well as referrals to community services. Working out of Council Fire Native Cultural Centre, it offers everything from spiritual

mentorship to sharing circles for Sixties Scoop survivors— Indigenous people who were taken from their families and placed in predominately White foster homes between the 1960s and 1980s.

Worship services are held every Sunday morning and offer an opportunity for Aboriginal Christian worship.

This is a time of storytelling, prayer, and sharing of a meal or activity led by an Indigenous Anglican priest or United Church of Canada minister. Chris Harper describes Sunday mornings at Council Fire as wonderfully unique: "Individuals come with such amazing, wonderful, colourful life experiences. The services are diverse and responsive rather than liturgically sequential. Every Sunday is an adventure." Sacred gatherings like these offer connection and healing while honouring the Creator and all of creation. For urban Indigenous people living off reserve, they fill a vital need for spiritual and cultural community. If Mission & Service giving is already a regular part of your life, thank you so much! "The happiest day of my life has finally come," said Lotum Longolio, the day her nousehold had an opportunity to have a decent meal. Longolio, 25, lives with her husband and three children in Eastern Equatoria State of South Sudan.

"Today, I am overwhelmed with joy at the distribution site because it is the first time my household has received food assistance since I got married," she said. The distribution site was part of a PWRDF-led relief project that fed thousands last fall through our equity in Canadian Foodgrains Bank, a 4:1 match from Global Affairs Canada, and \$100,000 from the United Church of Canada towards this project.

PWRDF purchased 200 tonnes of sorghum (to make porridge), 27 tonnes of beans, 16 tonnes of cooking oil and 4 tonnes of salt. Adventist Development and Relief Agency (ADRA) South Sudan distributed the food, benefitting almost 9,000 people. It is a perfect example of how members of the Canadian Foodgrains Bank pool our resources to end hunger.

Some of the funds come through the sale of crops from Canadian farmers. They donate their land and time to grow the plants, but use donations from parishes and individuals to buy seed, fertilizer and other inputs. Our opportunity to give, means Lotum and her family have the opportunity to eat.

#### **Today the church remembers St Aiden of Lindisfarne.**

Aiden was a monk at Iona, Scotland who went on to become Bishop of Clogher. He resigned this and became a monk at Lindisfarne c.630. He then became Bishop of Northumbria based at Lindisfarne. On an occasion when pagans attacked King Oswald of Northumbria's forces at Bambrough, they piled wood around the city walls to burn it. Saint Aidan prayed for help, and a change in wind blew the smoke and flames over the pagan army.

Aidan was known for his knowledge of the Bible, his eloquent preaching, his personal holiness, simple life, scholarship, and charity to the poor. Miracle worker. He founded the Lindesfarne monastery that became not only a religious standard bearer, but a great storehouse of European literature and learning during the dark ages. He died on this day in the year 631AD.

Here's a prayer, not written by Aiden, but often associated with him.

Leave me alone with God as much as may be. As the tide draws the waters close in upon the shore, Make me an island, set apart, alone with you, God, holy to you.

Then with the turning of the tide


prepare me to carry your presence to the busy world beyond,
