#### The Great Thanksgiving:

What we do here, we do in imitation of what Jesus first did.

To his followers of every age, Jesus gave an example and command rooted in the experience he shared with his disciples in an upstairs room in Jerusalem. At his last meal with his friends Jesus called them and us to remember . . .

One: On the night before he was betrayed, gathered around a table with his friends, Jesus took bread, gave thanks to you, O God, broke it, and shared it among them, saying: All: this is my body broken for you and for all. Do this in remembrance of me. One: After supper, Jesus took the cup, and after giving you thanks, gave it to them, saying: All: drink this, all of you, this is the cup of the new covenant, which is poured out for all for the forgiveness of sins. As often as you do this, remember me.

Loving God we rejoice in the gift of your grace, remembering Christ's life and death, proclaiming his resurrection, waiting in hope for his coming again. Grant that, in praise and thanksgiving, we may so offer ourselves that our lives may proclaim the mystery of faith.
