The work of the Spirit (inclusive language)

"When the Helper comes, whom I will send to you from God, the Spirit of truth who comes from God, they will testify on my behalf. You also are to testify, because you have been with me from the beginning. But I have said these things to you so that when their hour comes you may remember that I told you about them. "I did not say these things to you from the beginning, because I was with you. But now I am going to him who sent me, yet none of you asks me, 'Where are you going?' But because I have said these things to you, sorrow has filled your hearts. Nevertheless, I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you, but if I go, I will send them to you. "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, they will guide you into all the truth, for they will not speak on their own but will speak whatever they hear, and they will declare to you the things that are to come. They will glorify me because they will take what is mine and declare it to you."

P: When the day of Pentecost had come, the believers were meeting together in one place. - P: But Peter, standing with the eleven, shouted to the crowd, 'People of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, make no mistake about this, listen to what I say. These people are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel': 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all people -
- A: Your sons and your daughters will prophesy, and your young people will see visions,
- B: And your old folk shall dream dreams.
- P: In those days I will pour out my Spirit upon all my servants, men and women alike, and they will prophesy. And I will show signs in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and clouds of smoke.

The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon will turn blood-red, before the coming of God's great and glorious day.
